Animal Crossings

Artist Richard Serra usually begins his designs with a model instead of a drawing. He likes to think about the relationship of elements he finds interesting to invent a new way to look at them.


His sculpture, My Curves Are Not Mad, is made up of two plates from Cor-Ten steel, a weather-proof material. Each plate is 14 feet tall, 44 feet long, and weighs over 50,000 pounds. That weight equals almost 8 African bush elephants!

Through this piece, Richard Serra allows us to see various elements of sculpture from a different perspective. Walk through the sculpture and mimic the movements and abilities of the following animals to learn new ways you may move through a space!

Hear like a snake

Snakes do not have ears! Use your ear plugs as you walk through the sculpture and notice how the lack of sound makes you feel.

Move like a rabbit



garden and notice how your body feels!



See like an eagle

Eagles can see more than
3 miles away! Using your
bincoculars, walk through
the sculpture and see
what new details you
notice!
